

Interested in expanding high school computer science?



The UTeach Institute at The University of Texas at Austin is recruiting schools and teachers to participate in a DOE-funded research project to broaden participation in and improve high school computer science learning.

UTeach and its research partner, American Institutes for Research, will study the implementation and impact of the curriculum on students and teachers.

Who is eligible to participate?

High school teachers with any content background or level of experience who have an interest in teaching computer science, but have not previously taught using the UTeach CSP curriculum.

When does the study start?

Rolling applications are open now. Study activities will start in summer 2020.

What is expected of my school or district in order to participate?

- Enroll students in grades 9-12 in at least one section of AP CS Principles for the 2020-21 academic year.
- Provide teacher- and student-level administrative data, including AP exam scores, as part of the study.
- Participate in research activities related to the research study.

What does this study offer to schools and teachers?

- **Two years free access** to the UTeach Computer Science Principles curriculum and teacher materials (\$1800 value)
- Online teacher professional development free of charge
- **\$1000 stipends** for participating teachers!
